Thank you for your interest in the National Hook-Up of Black Women, Inc., Joliet Chapter scholarship information. The National Hook-Up of Black Women, Inc., Joliet Chapter is a non-profit 501(c)3 charitable community organization dedicated to improving the lives of families through support of the arts, culture, education, and human service programs. The Joliet Chapter was established in October 1991.

About the National Hook-Up of Black Women Scholarship Program

Each year, NHBW awards scholarships up to \$1,000 to graduating seniors who has maintained good grades throughout high school and has participated in community service. The high school senior must be a full time student, live in Joliet and/or the surrounding cities, towns, of Will County.

Eligibility Criteria:

- ✓ *Be a college bound high school senior at the time of applying for the application.*
- ✓ *Be attending college for the first time in the fall of 2018.*
- ✓ *Be enrolled in either a two or four year accredited educational institution.*
- ✓ *Be in good academic standing with a GPA of 2.5 or higher.*
- ✓ *Agree to use the scholarship funds awarded only at an accredited institution.*

Application Process:

- ✓ *Eligible applicants must complete all sections of the application.*
- ✓ *A separate sealed official transcript from the high school must accompany the application.*
- ✓ *A 3 X 5 color picture of yourself (light background is preferred).*
- ✓ *Two typed letters of recommendation one from a school official and one from community leader.*

Essay Format:

- ✓ *500-word essay must be typed and doubled spaced.*

Essay Questions: (2)

- ✓ *What community service activity that you've participated in has meant the most to you?*
- ✓ *What made you decide to volunteer where you did?*

Please be as thorough as possibly when responding to the two questions above.
